## ACADEMIC REPORT

During the course of the term there have been examples of outstanding academic achievement and effort that deserve our collective recognition.

In January, pupils in Yr I I sat their mock GCSE exams with a level of performance that bodes very well for the summer. Top performers included Struan Dunlop and Alex Bailey who both achieved an average score of 8 or above.

We must also congratulate all those members of the U6 who have secured university offers for next year, together with a significant number of pupils in years I1 and I2 who have already made great progress preparing for the next stage completing as much as 50 or 60% of their Unifrog profiles.

In February the U6 pupils sat their mock exams. Leading performers included Freddie Bobbin (4 A\*s) and Ethan Page (3A\*s). Mr Holgate praised the Y13s for their hard work during the mocks. Hopefully a similar culture will be present in the summer term.

In the UK Linguistics Olympiad, at Intermediate level Struan Dunlop achieved Bronze.

In drama, Fin Tomlinson has received recalls for Royal Conservatoire of Scotland for Musical Theatre and at Central.

And finally David Udegbe won a scholarship offer from Immerse Education for their essays submitted in January to this national competition.
