

Summer Term means three things: Cricket, Tennis, Athletics!



Wargrave's tennis pedigree continues with notable successes throughout the term for Luca Dumas, Maksim Drozd and Brooke Haycock.

Brooke has been one of the most improved players throughout the year, and he was part of the U15 Boys Sussex County Champions. Well done to him.

Although there was a bit of a damp start to the season, the weather finally evened out and there have been some excellent cricket scores racked up. Most notably with no less than five members of the house consistently playing for the Ist XI: Aditya Kumar, Jack Greig, Paddy Cooper, Felix Mann and Ed Nolan. Paddy Cooper scored a century against the Stragglers of Asia and Jack Greig batted into the 90s against Christ Hospital and Aditya Kumar in the 80s in the same fixture. Ed Nolan scored 43 off 11 balls at another fixture in the season. This particular housemaster was very proud to see the combo of Cooper-Nolan score 108 and 56 in the last Saturday fixture of the season on College Field against Kings Canterbury,

with Ed finishing proceedings in dramatic fashion by hitting a ball for six and taking some tiles off Memorial block roof in the process.










Rothesay International LTA




























Interhouse competitions


