

Written in around 1599, the year the original Globe was built, *Hamlet* is widely considered to be Shakespeare's masterpiece. A new production of the play will be performed by an ensemble of artists who, according to incoming Artistic Director Michelle Terry, will explore the play as if for the first time, and will put the story and the storyteller at the heart of this exploration.

This is an exciting chance for our pupils to experience one of Shakespeare's greatest works as it would have been performed some 400 years ago. Currently celebrating a 'coming of age' and now in its 21st anniversary season, The Globe has established a reputation as the best place on Earth to see the Bard's plays performed. 

The internationally renowned Norah Sande Award attracts exceptional entrants including several BBC Young Musician of the Year finalists. The two days of performances have become a popular annual date in the cultural calendar of Eastbourne; a chance to hear some of the most exciting young adult pianists on the brink of their professional careers. Last year's winner wowed the weekend's audiences. At just 20 years

old, Maria Luc is the youngest winner of the award, which started in 2006, and she has already performed at Wigmore Hall and the Wales Millennium Centre, and is an orchestral pianist with the New Mozart Orchestra. She currently studies at the Royal Northern College of Music where she has won a commendation in the Beethoven, concerto and recital competitions and was awarded the Peter Donohoe and Fergal O'Mahoney Prize in the 2016 season. Maria was a full scholar at the Guildhall School of Music (Junior Department) at 12 where she was a prizewinner of the Jacques Samuel Piano Competition. She won a scholarship to Chetham's School of Music where she received her LSRM and studied at the Royal College of Music with Ian Fountain. Maria has played a series of themed concerts at the Chichester Festival for the past few years. She also enjoys composing and has had her compositions performed.

On Saturday, when entry is free, the semifinalists perform 20-minute programmes, and the audience is welcome to join and leave between competitors' performances. On Sunday, three finalists will each play a full recital programme incorporating classical, romantic and contemporary pieces, none of which will have been played during the semifinals. Tea is served while the adjudicators deliberate. The results will be announced about 5.00pm and the winner is presented with a cheque for £2,000 and a future recital opportunity.
