


MT24 SPORTS NEWS

HOCKEY

The girls hockey season has been exceptionally dynamic, featuring over 50 fixtures across 12 teams this half term. This success stems from a robust and extensive pre-season preparation in Breda, Holland, for the U14 and U16 squads, alongside the Nottingham Hockey Festival for the 1st XI.

The 1st XI advanced to the third round of the ISHC U19 Cup after a thrilling 4-3 victory over Reigate Grammar, following a tense 2-2 draw that was decided by penalty strokes. The 1st XI lost the third round match to Bede's 1-3 in a closely fought game. Additionally, the team progressed to the second round of the EHA National Cup after a narrow 1-0 win against Hurst but fell short to a talented Ardingly team. Their competitive spirit has resulted in impressive wins against Cranbrook and Roedean too. They played Brighton College, Hurst, Ardingly and Bede's for a chance to qualify for the regional indoor hockey finals and will play Woldingham School in the second round plate match next.

The U15As have also made it to the second round of the National Cup, securing a 1-0 victory over Brighton, but fell short after a challenging fixture against St George's, Weybridge. The girls will now wait to see who they face in the Plate Competition. However, this loss does not diminish the victories against Cranbrook and Roedean. Although the U14s narrowly lost to Hurst in their national cup match, they have enjoyed competitive fixtures against Roedean, Cranbrook, and Brighton, with a match against Ardingly to conclude the half term. Progress is evident within the 2nd XI with an excellent 1-1 draw v Ardingly last week. The U15B, and U14B teams, who have a full programme of upcoming matches after half term, have competed well too.

The boys indoor hockey season has started in an impressive manner. The U16s are Sussex Indoor Champions after a 4-0 over Hurst and then a thrilling 5-3 victory over Bede's School in the final. Similarly, the U18 boys beat Ardingly, Lancing and Seaford College to be crowned U18 Sussex Indoor Champions with both age groups now progressing through to the South Regional Play-Offs at St George's Weybridge.

We extend our congratulations to Bertie Cook (Y11), Rosie Hill (Y11), Jack Jordan (Y10), Will Fellows (Y11) Emma Valks (11), Tobias Bristow (Y10), Serena Patel (10) and Jessie Holgate (10) who are through to the next phase of the East Grinstead Hockey Club England Talent Pathway squad, best of luck to them all as they progress through the year with an aim of being at Nottingham next summer.




