

HOCKEY

The girls hockey teams showed the usual Eastbournian character during the term with commitment, determination, and perseverance. One hundred and fifty plus players in ten teams played over 70 fixtures. The 1st XI, from 19 matches played, won ten and drew four with a highlight in winning their final game of the term to progress to the quarter-final of the national plate in the Lent term. The 2nd XI were very competitive with three wins and two draws from seven; the U15As won over half their matches and won through to round four in the national plate too. There were some great results and matches played throughout all the teams during the season and, in addition, the inter-house hockey tournament was a great event.

The boys indoor U16 and U18 teams impressively won their respective county titles and qualified for the southeast regional rounds with the U18s reaching the semi-final and narrowly losing to the national finalists.

RUGBY

The rugby teams showed throughout the term the character Eastbourne rugby is known for: a never-give-up attitude. Over 200 boys competed in the 64 fixtures played during the term. The development of players was very impressive, as was the attitude to improve whether in the contact form of the game or touch rugby. The 1st XV had an impressive year winning 67% of games, with the highlight being the Eltham festival where they took home the trophy after only conceding three points over five games in wet challenging conditions. They also finished runner up in the Churcher's tournament too. The 2nd XV worked tirelessly throughout the season with some impressive performances on the pitch and some incredibly close games which went both ways at times. The U16 teams had some fantastic games but fell on the wrong side of the scoreboard on a few occasions. All teams and players are worthy of a mention with three other teams having won 50% or better during the season with the U15A, U14A and U14B teams leading the way. Christmas brought the conclusion of rugby for the junior end of the school but rugby continues in the Lent term with the seniors and fixtures before the build up to the national Rosslyn Park 7s, the world's biggest rugby tournament.

Seven riders competed at Felbridge in the NSEA county show jumping qualifiers. We had, from St Andrew's, Milly P and Darcie W, and, from the College, Freya W, Mattie K, Meg L, Darcy D and Lola W.

In the 70-75cm class we had a brilliant clear round from Freya W and she placed seventh individually. Mattie had just four faults and Milly rode a really great round. The 80-85cm class saw an amazing clear round from Darcie W, which placed her third in the county and qualified her for the RPL at Hickstead in the summer. Mattie made her 80-85cm debut and had just one pole fall, with Lola completing a clear round too, which picked the team up fourth place.

The 90-95cm saw the team get fourth place, with Meg putting in a clear round, finishing tenth. Lola having just one pole down but being the second fastest four fault time and finishing thirteenth. Darcy rode a strong round again just having one pole down and coming fourteenth.

In the Im-1.05m class, both Meg and Darcy rode really well, both just tapping a pole each finishing on four faults. It was a brilliant outing and all of the pupils supported each other so well. The girls have been training well, despite the cold wet weather with Mathilda attending the Grassroots final at Felbridge at the end of the term.

Round two of the Schools Super League was a real success, with the College hosting another three schools. We are currently in fourth position of the overall competition with 32 schools taking part.
